

PEA3. Fees and Policy and Procedures for the award of Scholarships

1. Tuition Fees

Tuition fees are reviewed annually by CITY ULE and vary by course and level of study. However, students who enroll with a particular tuition fee will retain it for the normal duration of their studies.

CITY ULE students are required to pay tuition fees to cover the cost of their teaching and learning experience. The fees paid by students studying at CITY ULE cover the costs of tuition, supervision, access to resources, exams, and an academic transcript.

Applicants are required to pay a registration fee to cover administrative functions undertaken by the Admissions Office (e.g. to progress their application and respond to any relevant requests). No additional financial obligations exist beyond the specified fees.

Reading materials are available in the library for study purposes, with most resources accessible online. Purchasing books is not mandatory, as students can rely on the available resources.

Students who fail to progress according to the University regulations but have been deemed by the Board of Examiners to repeat part of the whole year of study, are required to pay additional fees corresponding to the part of study they should repeat.

Information relating to tuition fees payment terms is included in the offer letter the applicant receives. Students may pay their fees in predefined installments throughout their studies. The tuition fee payable for undergraduate, postgraduate and research studies is equivalent to the fees for an academic year.

The offer of admission will confirm the tuition fees to be charged, including any scholarships, based on the programme of study and the applicant's fee status. This decision is based on the information provided within the application form and the scholarship form (if any). By accepting the offer of admission, applicants are accepting CITY ULE's decision in relation to their fee status. Once an offer has been made, applicants are required to carefully read their offer letter and the tuition fee payment terms, accept the offer, and, if required, pay a deposit to secure their place.

2. Scholarships Policy

CITY ULE is committed to making higher education accessible to all qualified prospective and continuing students. To support students in their educational journey, CITY ULE offers various scholarship opportunities, providing non-repayable financial assistance toward tuition fees.

CITY ULE has established a structured policy and procedures framework for awarding scholarships to ensure fairness and transparency. Each academic year, Merit-Based and Need-Based scholarships will be granted to at least up to 10% of registered students, based on predefined criteria established by CITY ULE before announcing the scholarships each year and published on CITY ULE's website.

The types of scholarships are:

1. Merit-Based Scholarships

- **Description:** Awarded to students who demonstrate exceptional academic, athletic, or extracurricular achievements.
- **Eligibility:** Open to both new and continuing students who meet eligibility criteria.
- **Application:** Applicants must fill in the scholarship application form, and submit supporting documentation according to the announced procedures.
- **Duration:** Awarded for one or more years, as specified in the scholarship announcement.

2. Need-Based Scholarships

- **Description:** Designed to assist students from disadvantaged socioeconomic backgrounds, those facing financial hardship and serious health problems.
- **Eligibility:** Open to both new and continuing students who meet eligibility criteria.
- **Application:** Applicants must fill in the scholarship application form, and submit supporting documentation according to the announced procedures.
- **Duration:** Awarded for one or more years, as specified in the scholarship announcement.

CITY ULE reserves the right to amend scholarship policies and procedures as necessary.

3. Procedures for the award of scholarships

3.1 Application Process

The application Processes are outlined below:

a. Merit-Based and Need-Based Scholarships (New Entrant Students)

- New entrant students must submit their scholarship application along with their application for admission to the academic programme.
- Applications should be completed and submitted to CITY ULE within the designated application period.
- Supporting documents, such as academic records (for merit-based scholarships) or socioeconomic/financial documentation (for need-based scholarships), must be submitted during the application process.

b. Merit-Based and Need-Based Scholarships (Continuing Students)

- Continuing students must apply for scholarships annually after the results announcement of their final examinations (end of spring semester).
- Applications should be submitted to the Academic Services Department within the specified timeframe.
- Supporting documents, such as academic records (for merit-based scholarships) or socioeconomic/financial documentation (for need-based scholarships), must be submitted during the application process.

3.2 Evaluation and Selection

The Academic Services Department will review all applications based on the predefined criteria established by CITY ULE before announcing the scholarships each year.

- For merit-based scholarships, the Office will assess academic performance, athletic achievements, or extracurricular distinctions.
- For need-based scholarships, assessments will be conducted based on the submitted socioeconomic/financial documents.
- The selection process will ensure fairness and transparency in awarding scholarships to at least up to 10% of registered students per academic year.

3.3 Notification and Acceptance

- Successful applicants will receive official notification via email from the CITY ULE Academic Services Department.
- Students must accept the scholarship offer by submitting a confirmation form within the deadline specified in the award notification.
- Failure to accept the award within the given timeframe may result in the forfeiture of the scholarship.

3.4 Compliance and Obligations

- Scholarship recipients must comply with all university regulations and maintain satisfactory academic standing.
- Any breach of university policies, including academic misconduct, may result in the revocation of the scholarship.
- Scholarship recipients are encouraged to participate in university activities and events to uphold the values of CITY ULE.
